

Deacon's Corner

Arise

In today's Gospel, we hear the story of the death of Jairus' 12-year-old daughter. Jairus was a well-known, high-ranking religious leader and official in the synagogue at Capernaum, and he had come to Jesus to ask for a healing of his daughter's illness. Jairus knows that the situation is desperate, so he humbles himself before Jesus, throws himself at the feet of Jesus, and begs Jesus to heal his daughter. Before Jesus can even get to Jairus' house, word is sent that Jesus is no longer needed and that the young girl is already dead. Jesus, however, continues toward Jairus' home, and as he gets closer, he can hear the mourners crying, weeping, and grieving the death of Jairus' daughter.

But Jesus announces, "The child is not dead, but asleep." After being ridiculed by those in attendance, Jesus entered the young girl's room, took her hand in his, and called to her, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" And the 12-year-old girl immediately arose and walked around.

For whatever reason, Jesus wanted to demonstrate his power over death by giving life back to Jairus' daughter. Jesus came to give life back to his people, the life that was originally given up in the Garden by Adam and Eve. Through sin, death entered the world. The consequence of sin is death, but through the redemption of Jesus, eternal life has been given to all who will receive it.

This is what Jesus demonstrates in the Gospel. He is the ruler of life, and death has no power over him. Through his Resurrection, Jesus defeats sin and the consequence of death for all time. We, who are brothers and sisters in Christ, die with him in Baptism and will rise to new life with him in the Resurrection. Our death on this earth makes possible our eternal life in Heaven, and as such, is cause for rejoicing. Those of us who remain miss our loved ones and suffer in their absence, but they are truly in a better place, the best place, the very bosom of Christ, where the pains of sin no longer have sting.

Perhaps we can take a little time this week to think about and pray for our continual conversion, that we may be ready when God calls us from this world. Jesus has already defeated death through his sacrificial offering of himself for our sins. Have we truly accepted that gift? Do we live our lives in faith, with the joy of the hope we have in the Resurrection? Are we true disciples of Jesus, people of transformation and renewal, that constantly challenge our world with the love, mercy, and forgiveness of Christ? May we live out our Christian calling as we are carefully reminded by the words in today's Gospel, "Do not be afraid; just have faith."



From the Health and Wellness Ministry **Firework Safety from the CDC**

Fireworks-related injuries are most common on July 4 and New Year’s Eve. Fireworks can cause death and injury, including burns, contusions, lacerations, and foreign objects in the eye. Make the choice to protect yourself and your family from fireworks injuries.

- Never allow young children to play with or ignite fireworks.
- Always have an adult supervise fireworks activities.
- Avoid buying fireworks packaged in brown paper, which often means they were made for professional displays and could be dangerous for consumers.
- Make sure you, your kids, and others watch fireworks displays from a safe distance.
- Call 911 immediately if someone is injured from fireworks.
